English

Daily Reviews

Years 5 & 6

This term we will cover:

- Conventions of Language such as spelling, punctuation and capitalisation
- How to use parts of speech to form complete sentences i.e nouns, adjectives and verbs
- The difference between proper nouns and nouns
- Spelling of high frequency words such as their, does and said

Phonics/Word Knowledge/Morphology

Years 5 & 6

This term we will cover:

- The common letter patterns and their use in more complex words during weekly spelling
- Students will develop their phonological awareness and morphology (word definitions).
- Each week, your child will write a new list of words in their diary, to practise daily at both school and home
- Students will complete a spelling test at end of the week to measure their growth and set spelling goals
- Regular practice will help build confidence and strengthen spelling skills. Thank you for your ongoing support!

Dictation

Years 5 & 6

This term we will cover:

- Students will practice applying spelling patterns, handwriting fluency and language conventions while a teacher reads aloud simple, compound and complex sentences.
- Once a week students will listen to the teacher read aloud sentences that contain words that include the spelling focus of the week.

Handwriting

Years 5 & 6

This term we will cover:

- Students will develop a fluent handwriting style by practicing handwriting daily
- Students will use handwriting efficiently to communicate their ideas
- Students will develop consistency with their letter formation
- We have introduced Victorian cursive with joining loops for those who are ready for it.

Fluency

Years 5 & 6

This term we will cover:

- Teachers will model fluent reading, demonstrating accurate reading, appropriate rate and good phrasing, intonation and expression
- Students will read short passages to practice their reading rate, expression and word accuracy
- Students will track their reading progress by setting personal fluency goals and monitoring their growth through weekly fluency read-alouds
- Students will participate in regular MAZE (Multiple-choice Cloze) fluency reads to develop reading rate and word accuracy

Reading /Vocabulary/Comprehension

Years 5 &6

This term we will cover:

- Students will analyse and discuss author techniques in our mentor text, 'Nevermoor' by Jessica Townsend
- Students will decode and explain the meaning of archaic and complex vocabulary in 'Nevermoor' i.e. scarcity and formidable
- Students will read their Just Right Reader (JRR) during regular Accountable Independent Reading lessons
- Students will show comprehension of texts by discussing the impact of language features on the tone and mood of a story
- Students will use text evidence to make predictions, draw connections, summarise key ideas, and respond to comprehension questions about our mentor text and their JRR

Reading

Years 5 &6

This term we will cover:

- Students will read daily at home and record in their diary
- Students will listen to their family, peers and teachers read

Writing-Seven Steps

Our school uses the Seven Steps framework for developing student writing skills.

A large component of the Seven Steps program is thinking and talking. As they say, "Verbal is vital."

This term we will cover:

Years 5 & 6

- We will continue to explore the 'Seven Steps Writing' process in developing writing to Entertain and writing to persuade an audience.
- Students will practice the conventions of writing, focusing on sentence structure, punctuation, paragraphs, nouns, adjectives
- Students will practice writing simple, compound and complex sentence
- Students will write 'Sizzling Starts' to engage the reader
- Students will practice writing cohesive paragraphs, that include a topic sentence, main idea, supporting detail, transitions and conclusions
- Students will follow the '7-Steps to Writing Success' to plan, draft, edit and revise short texts

Maths

This term we will cover:

Years 5 &6

- The mindset and strategies of mathematicians
- Explore the properties of composite, triangular, prime numbers
- Students will explain, write, read and expand whole numbers
- Practice counting in multiples and patterns
- Collect, sort and display real life data sets
- Use addition strategies to find the average of data sets
- Develop strategies to solve simple multiplication and division problems
- Developing strategies to solve problems using rich tasks
- Participate in problem solving, active math and authentic applications of key number skills.

Inquiry

Years 5 &6

This term we will cover:

Inquiry Unit: My Identity!

Students will explore the questions

- How am I influenced by others?
- How can I support myself and others to cope with challenges?
- How do experiences shape my identity?
- What is a responsible risk?
- How do I respond to pressure?
- What are some changes that may occur during puberty?
- We will cover health, social and personal capabilities, ethical capabilities
